Overview

Welcome to Photoshop...I am very excited about the course and I look forward to a quarter of teaching this amazing software. Photoshop is a very comprehensive, image editing software that is industry standard and used around the world. Photoshop will be taught assuming the user has no prior knowledge of the software. As the quarter progresses, the work will advance and the material will increase proportionately to your newly learned skills. At the end of the course, the student will be proficient in the use of Photoshop and will be able to edit images in a multitude of ways. Students will also complete a portfolio to showcasing work.

Software/Computers/Classwork

Photoshop software is provided for you on the De Anza **Computers**. **Class work** and exercises to be turned in for grading will be completed in class. Assignments will come directly from the book, along with additional training assignments the instructor provides.

Portfolio – Students will save their work and build a portfolio. The images you use must be your own photos. If you use the photos from the book, site the source in your portfolio. You will show your photos to the class mid-quarter and the final week of class. Be prepared to discuss how you edited the photos. I recommend you have notes below the photo highlighting and illustrating the Photoshop techniques you have applied. See portfolio rubric.

Requirements

The book is required for this class. Chapter work will be completed and turned from the book. A USB memory stick is also needed for the class. Please bring ear buds to listen to my training videos.

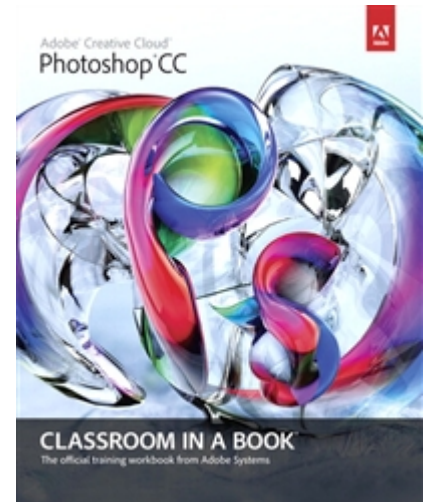
