**Advisory:** English Writing 200 and Reading 200 (or Language Arts 200), or English as a Second Language 261, 262 and 263.

**Course Description:** Survey of ceramic construction techniques. Use of surface decoration, glazes, and ceramic kiln firing.

# **Student Learning Outcome (SLO)**

- -Students will be able to demonstrate competency in basic construction techniques; pinch, coil, slab, and wheel.
- -Students will be able to demonstrate competency in glaze application.
- -Students will be able to explain important environmental and human safety concerns in ceramics.

# **Course Objectives:**

- -Demonstrate a working knowledge of the ceramic lab operation.
- -Develop skills in various methods of forming, firing, and decorating clay.
- -Develop an understanding of art making as a process.
- -Develop an understanding of the nature and importance of ceramic objects
- -Develop a portfolio of finished clay pieces.

# **Participation:**

Attendance and participation are essential for students to be successful in both art and academics. Students are expected to want to be in class each day and be active in their and other's education. If you are absent, please let me know the reason for the absence as soon as possible. Each class period will have new material presented and if you miss it is your responsibility to make sure that you learn the material and make up any assignments that you missed when allowed . You are free to ask other students to take notes for you so that you understand the information presented or ask me about it during my office hour before class. There will be a brief "Class 15 Minute Sketch" at the beginning of each class you must be present and on time to receive points for this classroom assignment. These assignments cannot be made up.

If you are unable to complete the class, it is your responsibility to drop the class through the Admissions and Records office. You should not ghost the class this will result in a F.

#### Criteria for Evaluation:

A high degree of commitment to this class is expected. Your presence, persistence, imagination, attention to detail, and level of involvement will help to determine the quality of your work.

### Projects will be graded according to the following criteria:

20% for work made in greenware (clay forms that are unfired)

20% for work made and bisqued (clay forms that have gone through the 1st firing process)

20% for work glazed fired (clay forms that have gone through both firings and are glazed)

15% for craftsmanship (attention to detail and quality of work)

15% for execution of technique (proper construction, decoration, and glazing techniques used)

10% for creativity

# **Art 18A Class Projects**

### 1. 3 Pinch Pots (Weeks 1-3) 10 points each (due April 24)

- 1.**Bowl**: Create a bowl that is wider than it is tall. Focus on even wall thickness, smooth surfaces, and an aesthetically pleasing form. Consider how the proportions and curves contribute to the overall design. Must have a width between 4-5 inches.
- 2.**Cylinder**: Construct a cylinder that is taller than it is wide. Emphasize verticality, consistent wall thickness, and a slightly textured surface finish. Experiment with proportion, depressions, and textures to explore different expressive possibilities. Must have a height between 4-6 inches.
- 3.**Hollow Sculptural Form**: Design and construct a hollow sculptural deity or Venus figurine. Incorporate symbolic or aesthetic elements that express cultural, spiritual, or personal themes. Pay attention to balance, volume, and surface texture to create a visually compelling piece. Height between 6-10 inches. Width no more than 8 inches.

#### 2. Coil Form with use of slip for decoration (Weeks 4-6) 30 points (due May 8)

Create a coil-built ceramic form representing a self-portrait. Your piece can be realistic, abstract, or a perceived interpretation of yourself. Use slip as a decorative element to enhance your design. Dimensions must have a height between 10-12 inches and width between 6-10 inches.

#### 3. Slab Built Form (Weeks 7-9) 30 points (due May 29)

Design and create a geometric form using slab-building techniques. Your form must include at least one opening to accommodate a single organic plant, combining structured geometry with natural elements.

# 4. 3 Wheel Thrown Pots 1 with stain decoration (Weeks 9-11) 10 points each (due June 24)

- 1.**Bowl**: Throw a bowl with a wide, open shape that is at least 4 inches in diameter and clearly wider than it is tall, focusing on even walls and a balanced form.
- 2. Cylinder: Create a tall, vertical form that is at least 4 inches in height and taller than it is wide, showcasing clean lines and a stable base.
- 3. Thrown Form with an attached component: Design a piece incorporating at least one attached component, such as a handle or lid, with the form measuring a minimum of 4 inches in one dimension and demonstrating strong, seamless connections.
